There is so much going on! First and foremost I want to thank everyone for being so patient and helping to spread the word about the delay day. Because the snow actually happened so late and it was so heavy for a bit there, the decision was made later than usual. We are looking into a notification system for our parent community, but for now, watch the network news (4, 7 and 13), call the main school number for a recording or check the website. Those notifications happen as quickly as the electronics let us access those venues.

For you! – we have a schedule change coming in March. As many of you know, the PARCC testing window is throughout the month of March. We have derived a schedule for testing and we believe the impact on our learning will be minimal and the benefits (what we learn and assessing what our students know) maximal. Here is the change-

March 9, 10 & 11 are *regular* school days with no early release or student-led conferences being held. 3rd quarter report cards will go home on March 13.

April 15, 16 & 17 will be early release days (1:00) with student-led conferences being held.

- If you are interested in acting as a test proctor for sessions of the PARCC, please contact Ms. McConnell at the phone number or email address below. Incidentally, it would be very helpful if you marked these dates on your calendars (3rd thru 8th grade) and tried *not* to schedule appointments, vacations, lunch dates, etc. for students. Our testing attendance is part of our state grade, and it is also information that will be helpful to you in terms of your child's academic progress.





NORTH VALLEY ACADEMY 2015 FAMILY EGG DROP CHALLENGE January 22 6:00-7:30PM

Bring your completed designs on science night. Originality and creativity are appreciated, but your design needs to follow these guidelines:

- Design cannot involve liquids, helium, other lighter-than-air gasses, or glass.
- Weight cannot exceed one pound.
- Egg "compartment" cannot exceed one foot in length or width. Winged designs need to fall within this dimension.
- You must be able to place your egg into your container just prior to your drop.
 NVA will provide each entry with a grade A, fully inspected chicken egg!
- Use of parachutes is allowed, but the chute must deploy itself after the container is dropped. Dropping with an open parachute will almost certainly result in successful landing. Using other methods within the guidelines presented here will make for a more interesting challenge.
- The lightest, safely landing contraption will be the champion!
